- Measurers in attendance Paul Nuechterlein; Brian Shenstone; John Harper. Commodore David mentioned it's hard to tell what is original or second or third generation repairs nowadays. The class goal is to keep the boat as close to first generational as possible. We all want an enjoyable and competitive one design class.
- Per B. Shenstone Don Kressbaum has a green Cal 25 in almost pristine condition.
 - The boat hasn't been sailed much and has been at the City Park for a long time. Brian looked at foils and it says they are about as original as any boat I have seen ie. Shape of keel & rudder. John Harper mentioned that perhaps we could create a template of the keel.
 - Per D. Marshall if anyone wants to buy the boat he wants to find a Detroit person or someone in the class to buy it. He is flexible on price. He has an ad on the website. Dale been on boat – "Price is right." Rudy says boat pristine.
- Sailors beware Rudy took his mast down and found only 3 strands on headstay intact. Be sure to inspect all your equipment before and after each season.

 - Commodore "what you have here in handout is just all the different ratings for a Cal25 in U.S."
 - The concern that our rating could go the wrong way was voiced
 - Pat says I believe an A symmetrical bigger than regular spinnakers and could cause a rating concern
 - DRYA meeting scheduled Oct-31 Eric Ryan to sit on board of review
 - No one volunteered to assist Eric Halloween night could be problematic
 - Commodore Holme to email Eric of no volunteers
- Last year's Christmas party at CSYC was well attended but the Class Awards party was not well attended.
